

## **U.S. METRO AREA ECONOMIC FREEDOM INDEX**





Nation- and state-level research finds many markers of prosperity are directly associated with economic freedom:



- Overall Income
- Entrepreneurial Activity
- Per Capita Income
- Net In-Migration Population
- Local Government Credit Ratings
- Female Labor Market Participation
- Local Government Credit Ratings

But is high state-level economic freedom reflected in prosperity markers more locally? Examining U.S. metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) finds that local economic freedom is a good predictor of prosperity markers of population growth and per capita income:





Local economies tend to follow the lead of their states: High economic freedom states, such as Florida and Texas, have high economic freedom MSAs; low economic freedom states, such as California and New Jersey, have low economic freedom MSAs—in both high and low population MSAs.
